<p><u>Vulnerability in the local community</u> Our pupils are at risk of engaging with content that is outside of British Values when out in the local and wider community, including being exposed to the extreme view of those around them, thus making them high risk of being radicalised.</p> <p>In the most recent <i>Counter Terrorism Policing Report from East Midlands 2023</i>, extreme right wing terrorism has been recognised as an area of concern. It has been identified that activity in Lincolnshire is mostly online involving young people inspired by conspiracy theories and racist stereotypes about ethnic minorities. <p><u>Pupil inability to critically assess information shared to them online and offline</u> In the most recent <i>Counter Terrorism Policing Report from East Midlands 2023</i>, extreme right wing terrorism has been recognised as an area of concern. It has been identified that hostile reconnaissance is a concern. Budding terrorists conduct research as part of their attack planning. Signs to look out for include: loitering in restricted or non public areas. Observing or photographing entrances, exit exits, seek cameras, security features or staff. Asking unusual questions. Hiding their faces or using a disguise. Vehicles retracing routes, parked out of place or abandoned.</p>	<p>Due to their additional needs and in many cases increased naivety and a delay in social understanding and boundaries, our pupils are particularly vulnerable to understanding potential dangers and hazards presented with information shared to them in all contexts. Examples of this include, online chat forums, all social media platforms and social situations with peers and strangers or less familiar people.</p> <p>Our pupils are especially susceptible to Hostile Reconnaissance due to their challenges with recognising and understanding unacceptable social behaviours.</p>		<p>Staff access annual online and face to face Prevent and Radicalisation training.
